Labor Doula Scholarship Program

Birthingway has just expanded our Labor Doula Scholarship program. We are very excited to share our commitment to serving the needs of underserved populations in the childbearing year.

The scholarship has expanded to assist three communities that often face roadblocks to services. Our program now offers a limited number of scholarships to someone within these communities:

- Bilingual (native language and English) students
- Students who work with, or are part of, the incarcerated women's community
- Students who work with, or are part of, the homeless women's population

Students must demonstrate both enthusiasm for doula work and the ability to bring this work back to their specific community.

Students must complete a scholarship application, submit it to the Specialized Programs Coordinator and pay the appropriate fees including the course-pack fees and any late fees that may apply. Once accepted, the scholarship students will then attend and complete Birthingway's Labor Doula workshop. After completing the workshop, the student is then responsible to join the practicum and to attend five births in their designated community for free. (These communities are: native/non-English speaking clients, incarcerated women or homeless women.) In addition, the student must share her knowledge of her specific community with other Birthingway doulas during a workshop session.

Workshop, which is the first step in becoming certified, will be offered spring 2011. See the upcoming spring newsletter for more information.



- ♦ **Birth Stories (BST311q)** One credit hour. Four sessions. Read, write and tell birth stories while learning and exploring effective storytelling techniques. Limited to eight students. Taught by Kathryn Constant, MLS

 Date: Thursday evenings starting 2/24, 3/3, 3/10, 3/24/11 Time: 5:30pm − 8:30pm Location: Foster House
- ♦ **Botanicals III (BOT313q)** One credit hour. Four sessions. Prerequisite: Botanicals II (BOT 332q). Study specific herbs that are versatile and effective for a variety of conditions in women's health and in midwifery applications. Students create treatment plans for "client" classmates using botanical medicine, modifying as necessary and charting appropriately. - ♦ Breastfeeding II (BRF222q) Two credit hours. Five sessions. Prerequisite: Breastfeeding I (BRF211q) Students expand on their knowledge from BRF211q to assess and treat breastfeeding problems. Students utilize case studies and research projects to develop skills such as how to take a breastfeeding history of mother and baby, identification of presenting problems, and integrating counseling and education strategies into their breastfeeding support. Birthingway Facts

Drug Free Schools Program

Thank you to all who participated in the online survey this year to review Birthingway's Drug Free Schools Program. Our Drug Free Schools Policy is explained in detail in each year's *Student Handbook and Catalog*, as well as in our Annual Security Report available on the Birthingway website. The results of your survey have been summarized and will be submitted to Birthingway's Board of Directors for review.

We had 35 respondents to the online survey. In general, we had no respondents who thought that drug and/or alcohol abuse was a problem at Birthingway and 100% of respondents thought that our current system of informing students of our policy was sufficient. 73.5% of respondents recalled receiving the information within the last year. Two respondents wrote that if drug or alcohol abuse should become a problem in the future, we would need to put more in place.

Constitution Day

Each year on September 17, schools all around the country, including Birthingway, partake in Constitution Day. Constitution Day was originally the brain child of the late West Virginia Senator Robert Byrd and was mandated for all schools (and federal agencies) that receive federal funds as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2005.

Byrd, who passed away this June and who was known for carrying a U.S. Constitution in his pocket, pushed this provision to address what he saw as widespread ignorance of American history. The main criticism of the passing of this act is that Constitution Day represents a small step toward federal regulation of school curriculum.

Birthingway observes Constitution Day each year with a week of activities that have included everything from a potty page dedicated to your favorite amendment to Bill of Rights bookmarks



for all students. But what, outside of these little activities, is the importance of the Constitution for students practicing the midwifery arts and sciences?

As our esteemed staffacultydent Nichole Reding says, "The American Constitution serves as the foundational document for all legislation and jurisprudence in the United States. As we know from current Oregon Health Licensing Agency (OHLA) and potential legislative action regarding Direct Entry Midwifery in the state of Oregon, the laws direct our ability to practice and the ways that we are able to offer our services. Constitution Day is a reminder to us all to stay in touch with political activity."

Recipe

Whole-Grain Zucchini Apple Bread

(Serves 10)

INGREDIENTS:

- Olive oil cooking spray
- 1 1/4 cups whole-wheat flour
- ¼ cup spelt flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp baking soda
- ½ tbsp cinnamon, ground
- ¼ tsp fine sea salt
- 1 apple, grated
- 1 zucchini, grated
- 1 egg
- ½ cup nonfat plain Greekstyle yogurt
- ¼ cup raw honey



INSTRUCTIONS:

ONE: Preheat oven to 350° F. Mist an 8 x 4-inch or 9 x 5-inch loaf pan with cooking spray.

TWO: In a large bowl, whisk together flours, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon and salt; set aside.

THREE: In a separate bowl, whisk together apple, zucchini, egg, yogurt and honey.

FOUR: Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients and fold until just combined. Spread batter into prepared pan and bake until golden brown, 40 – 45 minutes.
