A Look Back: Celebrating 20 Years of Birthingway

In 1993, Birthingway College of Midwifery started out as a six-month study group in the home of Holly Scholles. It was clear that six months would not be enough: the women involved in this program were on fire to learn as much as they could about midwifery. Within four years the study group became a three year program and was on track to gain MEAC accreditation. As the program grew, changes came swiftly. A large old house in Southeast Portland became our new home in 1999. Change has been an ongoing part of our growth. Many instructors and preceptors have joined us over the years; we were authorized by the State of Oregon to offer a Bachelor of Science in Midwifery Degree, and we have been able to offer Title IV Financial Aid. In addition to midwifery, for several years Birthingway has educated Lactation Consultants, Labor Doulas, Postpartum Doulas and Childbirth Educators.

Yet with all of this growth, the values and beliefs at Birthingway's core remain intact. We are a community learning together, teachers and students alike. We are fortunate to have many "specialists" on our faculty who have a tremendous amount of knowledge to share with our students, and yet, in every class, we incorporate time and opportunity for students and faculty to learn from each other. We honor and encourage diversity and multivocality, not just on paper, but in classes every day,

on our committees, and in our decision-making processes. We are relationship based, emphasizing face-to-face interactions, communication skills, kindness, compassion, and personal integrity and responsibility. At the foundation of all of our programs is the philosophical model we refer to as biodynamic birth, in which childbirth is not only a natural part of human life, it is a necessary part, intimately connected with what it is to be human.

The "bio" in biodynamic reflects broad biological themes, while the "dynamic" aspects ensure that our model is very woman-centered and individualized. Biodynamic birth emphasizes the known physiological aspects of birth, particularly the hormonal pathways that can help or hinder birth, including ways to increase the beneficial and necessary hormones such as oxytocin "the love hormone," while decreasing the interfering hormones such as adrenaline. This model encourages women to allow themselves to move into their instinctual birthing and breastfeeding bodies, and out of their rational thinking brains.

We are proud of the ways in which Birthingway has grown and changed and yet held on to our core values and models of learning. We hope to continue this path and look forward to many more years of working with amazing students as they pursue their dreams of serving women and families.

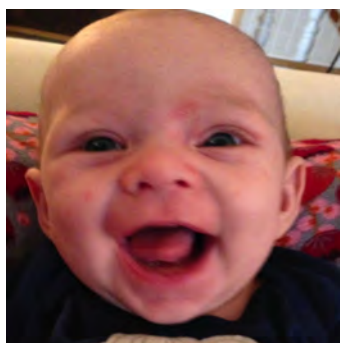

Community Spotlight



Carrie McCormick, CPM Midwife & International Activist

When and how did you become part of the Birthingway community?

I was part of the initial study group in 1993 that evolved into Birthingway! We were a group of women, many of whom are still involved with the school and are practicing midwives, that came together in Bonnie McAnnis' living room to study and motivate each other as we pursued midwifery skills and knowledge.

Holly joined us as the facilitator for our study group and was, of course, superb as a teacher and guide. Before we knew it, we were no longer in Bonnie's living room but meeting around a large round table in Holly's home and we were in school! I recall it being a very natural outcome of studying together – having no idea that someday Birthingway would evolve into one of the preeminent midwifery schools in North America!

What different types of jobs/roles have you done throughout the years?

I've worn many hats within the Birthingway community: student, teacher, faculty coordinator, board member, and belly and IV model. Hanging around for 20 years gives one ample time to try out lots of jobs.

Concurrent with my Birthingway involvement I studied for a Masters of Public Health while tending bar at a swank billiards club, guiding river and mountain adventures for Outward Bound, apprenticing myself to any local and international midwives that would have me, and having the opportunity to work as an apprentice, assistant, and partner with several Portland area midwives, learning a tremendous amount from them.

I married my long distance sweetheart and moved to Central Europe and began working with a group of Hungarian women trying to change incredibly hostile birth conditions, then returned to my beloved Kenya to teach and learn from traditional birth attendants on the shores of Lake Victoria.

Then I embarked on the greatest adventure of all, motherhood, and have gotten to share my love of travel with my daughter, taking her along when I joined the African Birth Collective and worked in remote maternity centers in Senegal. I've taught yoga and played on a competitive badminton team while living in the Middle East and just last week had the opportunity to be doula to a dear friend's son and daughter-in-law...

How has being apart of the Birthingway community impacted your life?

I'm not sure I can easily summarize the extent that to which being a part of the Birthingway community has impacted my life. It has given me structure, an anchor and a ticket to opportunities world wide. Most importantly, Birthingway has always provided a safe place - a deep and rich community of women to learn from, lean on, play, and grow with. Birthingway has been and continues to be a true gift in my life.

Since we are celebrating our 20th anniversary this year, do you have a favorite story to share?

Where to start . . . What comes to mind is not so much a story as a couple of things that Holly has instilled and exemplified for me – premises she's built the school on trust. Trust in birth, in women, in the power of following your passion, in the strength of community. That vision combined with small, steady steps produces amazing results and that it's worth the risk!

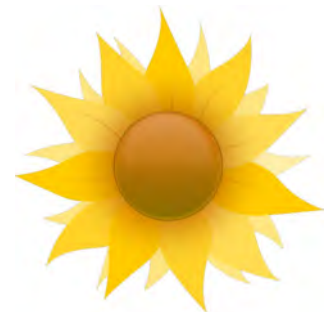
