#### **Birthingway's Traditions: Admissions Process**

Birthingway's admissions process reflects The applications can be quite lengthy, so our core values and beliefs as described in our Student Handbook and Catalog, especially those of relationship and multivocality.

The Birthingway community is formed by individuals, interactions between multiplied many times over. We support a model of power with and power within rather than the **power over** so common in our world.

We emphasize face to face interactions, compassionate communication skills and personal responsibility. We value kindness and the highest standard of personal integrity as essential characteristics of all members of our community. We value the feedback and insights that every member of our community brings to the table.

So how is all this reflected in our admissions process? Students who apply to Birthingway must be willing to share about themselves. The questions, both in the written application and the interview, seek to help the admissions team create a fuller picture of each applicant as an individual. The admissions team is made up of staff, faculty, and enrolled midwifery or lactation students, depending on the program. Each member of the team reads every application we receive.

this is a real commitment to the process of getting to know each applicant.

Each team member participates in a number of personal interviews as well, to help deepen that relationship with some of the candidates. The personal interviews are an opportunity for Birthingway to provide information about our community as well as to learn more about each applicant. These interviews are an example of the way we model power with and within. Although interviews intimidating, we try mix challenging questions with more light hearted ones.

Our final decision process, however, is the surest sign of our commitment to multivocality. We set aside a full day to discuss each applicant. Every member of the team attends this gathering. Each applicant is presented in the same way to the group and then the whole group discusses the candidates and votes. We choose through a consensus process and no one member of the admissions team has more or less say about the class selection, not even the President.

This creates a process that truly embodies how Birthingway's core values and beliefs.


#### Babies!!

As part of our Associates in Lactation Consultation (ALC) program, Birthingway offers on-campus clinical training experience, to those who qualify, though our Breastfeeding Center (BFC) - the only one of its kind in the country!

The BFC provides a unique experience for students to work with mothers and babies in both office and home settings.

We offer clients two-hour long visits and routinely do four to six, or more, visits per client. This affords students the opportunity to learn how to provide comprehensive and individualized biodynamic care.

At the BFC, students also develop the skills necessary to run a successful private lactation practice. Our students finish their work here ready to start providing excellent lactation care!

## Legend Drugs and Devices Renewal

Description:

Course includes 8.5 combined hours of theory, skills, and testing for Suturing, IV Skills, Medications by Injection, and Pharmacology. This course meets the Oregon state requirements for <u>renewal</u> of the Legend Drugs and Devices training to maintain licensure as an Oregon Direct Entry Midwife. LD&D must be renewed every two years once licensed. You must have completed the 40 hour LD&D sequence in order to take this workshop. Maternal and Neonatal Resuscitation is NOT covered in this workshop. Please see this newsletter for information about upcoming resuscitation workshops.

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
