With my last birth I did not go into labor naturally. The week before my son was born I thought I was going into labor all the time. I was sure he would come before school started. The night before he was born, I was making my potluck dish for Orientation. I felt different and I told him he needed to stay in there until Wednesday. He had different plans! I woke up around 5:30am with contractions that would not go away. We started packing up our things to head out to the Aurora Birth Center. I had no idea how long labor was going to last because I was already dilated to about 5cm. We arrived at the birth center at around 7:30pm. I was checked and was at about 6cm. As contractions became

stronger I didn't have faith that I could have this baby naturally. As it turned out the baby was posterior and it was making labor harder. I had to get out of the tub to get him to turn. I didn't really want to get out of the tub because it gave me so much pain relief. Once out of the tub I was on all fours. I had a couple of contractions and then had the innate urge to start pushing. It was like my body was taking over and pushing for me. I was worried about not making it back to the tub. I rushed back over to the tub before I had another contraction. I'm not sure how long it actually took but I finally could feel his head. He was so close! I had to tell myself it would only last a moment longer and I would have him in my arms. Finally, I able to bring my little one earth side. I couldn't believe I had done it! We made the decision to not find out the baby's sex until birth. I was excited to find out that it was a boy! Jaxson Ray Merritt was born April 13th at 1:38pm. He weighed 10lbs 11oz and was 22 inches long. I was attended by Susie Corcoran, Katrina Bubas-Stevens, Nora Hawkins, Em Stevenson and my doula, Mallory Warning.

Course includes 8.5 combined hours of theory, skills, and testing for Suturing, IV Skills, Medications by Injection, and Pharmacology. This course meets the Oregon state requirements for <a href="renewal">renewal</a> of the Legend Drugs and Devices training to maintain licensure as an Oregon Direct Entry Midwife. LD&D must be renewed every two years once licensed. You must have completed the 40 hour LD&D sequence in order to take this workshop. They continue to work with the coordinators at the schools, while reaching out to other programs, to practice their teaching skills and gain experience. The reward for this has been an overwhelming sense of empowerment and accomplishment for Taryn and Beverly who are committed to birth and breastfeeding education for pregnant teens and their partners.
