I woke up having contractions 7 weeks before my due date. I timed my contractions for a full 12 hours, with them getting longer, stronger, and closer together before heading to the hospital. When I got there, they gave me medicine to stop my contractions, and let my baby stay in longer to be more well-equipped for life on the outside. I was in the hospital for 4 days, receiving treatment for preeclampsia, and my contractions had stopped after my first night there. I was going to be discharged to go home and be on bedrest on the day that my water broke at 4:30am. After a whirlwind 4 hour unmedicated labor. Homer Pine Brown was born on 8/6 at 4lb10oz, and was perfect and doing great despite being so small. Although we had planned a peaceful September home birth, our crazy August hospital birth was beautiful, and the most wonderful thing I've ever done. In this course, students will study specific herbs that are versatile and effective for a variety of conditions in women's health and in midwifery applications. Students create treatment plans for "client" classmates using botanical medicine, modifying as necessary and charting appropriately. Taught by Mindy Cash, ND

Students expand on their knowledge from BRF211 to assess and treat breastfeeding problems. Students utilize case studies and research projects to develop skills such as how to take a breastfeeding history of mother and baby, identification of presenting problems, and integrating counseling and education strategies into their breastfeeding support.

Prerequisites: All midwifery core courses, Fetal Assessment (FET211q), Human Genetics (GEN231q), Breastfeeding II (BRF222q)

This is a capstone course; we recommend all midwifery courses are complete or in progress before taking this course. Using student created *Signs and Symptoms* book and protocols, students present case studies for differential diagnosis by their classmates. Students also create practice guidelines for antepartum, intrapartum, postpartum, and maternal and infant care, as well as develop risk assessment guidelines and client care checklists. This course will explore the physical and spiritual aspects of the human journey especially as it relates to pregnancy, birth, breastfeeding, and the postpartum period. Philosophical and theological concepts of natality, embodiment, and interconnection will be introduced. Lecture, role-play, self-reflections, and meditation and mindfulness practices, among other tools, will be used to enhance the students' application of holistic care for themselves and the families they serve in the perinatal period. From an ethnopediatric perspective, this course covers newborn behavior, development, bonding and attachment, and childrearing including attachment parenting. Taught by Heather Hack-Sullivan, BSM, CPM, LDM. **Maximum class size: 18**

Prerequisites: Breastfeeding III (BRF313q), Infancy (INF121q)

Biodynamic interactions with baby; cleft-lip and palate; genetic syndromes such as Down Syndrome; other screened disorders such as phenylketonuria; hypoglycemia; failure to thrive; hospitalization/surgery; infection; prematurity; multiples; pathological jaundice; birth injuries; gastro-intestinal disorders such as true reflux; allergies; attachment disorders; and adoption. Independent Study

This is student-led, independent research with an approved faculty member. Students interested in pursuing an Independent Study must initially complete an *Intent Form* designating the proposed topic, advisor, and credit value. Please meet with your program coordinator or the Faculty Coordinator for more information. Allow seven weeks prior to the term in which you will pursue the Independent Study to complete all preparatory steps. Course number will be determined by the Academic Coordinator based on rigor and amount of work.

Lactation Professional Standards and Practices (LPS221q)2 Cr5 sessionsThursdays: 1/7, 1/14, 1/21, 1/28, 2/4/161:30pm-5:30pmCarlton

Prerequisite: All Lactation Program courses must be completed or in progress

In this capstone course, students review our protocols, informed choice agreements, and info sheets to create a final binder of these. Taught by Melissa Cole, BS, IBCLC

Course meets Legend Drugs and Devices initial education requirements for Pharmacology and Medications by Injection required for Oregon midwifery licensure. Taught by Laura Bartko, CNM
